WELCOME TO THE NATIONAL WWII MUSEUM



DOG TAG EXPERIENCE

Watch for these interactive stations throughout the Museum. Each one is a chance to dig deeper into the history of a specific point in the war.

STEP 1

PICK UP YOUR DOG TAG

Each visitor receives one—it's free with the cost of admission.

STEP 2

REGISTER

At the L.W. "Pete" Kent Train Car Experience or adjacent kiosk have a real-life story assigned to you to follow.

STEP 3

EXPERIENCE

Check in at Dog Tag Stations throughout the galleries to get more information on the person whose real story you will follow.

The Arsenal of Democracy: The Herman and George R. Brown Salute to the Home Front

The Arsenal of Democracy exhibit tells the story of America's road to war and how it was fought on the Home Front. Through nine immersive galleries, visitors experience this chapter of history through personal narratives, evocative artifacts, and immersive environments that highlight facets of WWII-era American life.

The D-Day Invasion of Normandy

Debuted on The National D-Day Museum's opening on June 6, 2000—this exhibit tells the story of the American effort during the largest-ever amphibious invasion on June 6, 1944. Through the exhibit's Planning for Overlord and D-Day Beaches and Hedgerows galleries, visitors learn what the Allies faced in France.

The Duchossois Family Road to Berlin: European Theater Galleries

Road to Berlin brings to life the drama, sacrifices, personal stories, and strategies of America's campaign in Europe, Africa, and the Mediterranean in order to defeat the Axis powers and preserve freedom.

Richard C. Adkerson & Freeport-McMoRan Foundation Road to Tokyo: Pacific Theater Galleries

Road to Tokyo retraces the grueling path that led from Pearl Harbor to Tokyo Bay, highlighting critical naval warfare as well as air and land campaigns. Galleries explore the bloody battle for Guadalcanal and fighting in Southeast Asia, the Himalayas, Burma, China, India, and Alaska.



BUILDING NO. 4 HALL OF DEMOCRACY

Hall of Democracy is the new home for the Museum's Institute for the Study of War and Democracy and WWII Media and Education Center. Some of the sprawling pavilion's features include a fully-equipped media auditorium, new special exhibition hall, an education classroom, and a Museum Store outlet. The complex serves as a hub for disseminating WWII knowledge through online access to Museum initiatives, products, distance-learning activities, and digital programs.
