

What is the Territorial Sea?

A footnote from the Federal Circuit Courts decision says it best:

"In 1982, the United Nations Convention on the Law of the Sea ("UNCLOS") echoed the 1958 Convention, stating "[t]he sovereignty of a coastal State extends . . . to an adjacent belt of sea, described as the territorial sea, " having a breadth "not exceeding 12 nautical miles." Part II, arts. 2, 3, 1833 U.N.T.S. 397, 400 (Dec. 10, 1982)."

What is the Territorial Sea?

■ UNCLOS 1982 Part II Article 2:

Article2

Legal status of the territorial sea, of the air space over the territorial sea and of its bed and subsoil

1. The sovereignty of a coastal State extends, beyond its land territory and internal waters and, in the case of an archipelagic State, its archipelagic waters, to an adjacent belt of sea, described as the territorial sea.

UNCLOS 1982 Part II art 2 continued:

- 2. This sovereignty extends to the air space over the territorial sea as well as to its bed and subsoil.
- 3. The sovereignty over the territorial sea is exercised subject to this Convention and to other rules of international law.

UNCLOS Part II, art. 3

- Article3
- Breadth of the territorial sea
- Every State has the right to establish the breadth of its territorial sea up to a limit not exceeding 12 nautical miles, measured from baselines determined in accordance with this Convention.

UNCLOS Part II, art 7.

- Article 7
- Straight baselines
- 1. In localities where the coastline is deeply indented and cut into, or if there is a fringe of islands along the coast in its immediate vicinity, the method of straight baselines joining appropriate points may be employed in drawing the baseline from which the breadth of the territorial sea is measured.

United States Ocean Policy – Statement by President Reagan on March 10, 1983;

In this respect, the United States will recognize the rights of other states in the waters off their coasts, as reflected in the Convention, so long as the rights and freedoms of the United States and others under international law are recognized by such coastal states.

Board of Veterans Appeals Definition of Service in RVN - Case decided 5/8/2019


- □ For the purposes of determining whether a veteran may be presumed to have been exposed to herbicide agents, the term "Service in the Republic of Vietnam" includes service on the landmass, inland waterways, and in the territorial sea extending 12 nautical miles from the shores of that nation.
- Not IAW UNCLOS 1982


□ Page 2 VA Alledges: "The court did not address the evidence necessary to support a finding that a particular veteran served within the territorial sea of Vietnam."

- □ USS Intrepid CVS-11 July 1966 Deck Logs to show Alfred Procopio was indeed in the Territorial Sea of RVN, no where near 12nm ashore.

- 2000 08 56N 106 21E 20.24nm inside baseline 26.80nm from Mekong Delta Region


USS Intrepid CVS-11 July 1966 Deck Logs









Naval Gunfire Support Ships off RVN will always operate their NGFS missions inside 12nm of shore.
