- 1. Purpose. To promulgate information in accordance with reference (a) relative to the NMCB SIXTY-TWO Decommissioning Ceremony scheduled for 1900, 28 July 1989.
- 2. Scope. The organization of troops, uniform, equipment, assembly area, formations, rehearsals and administrative instructions are set forth in this Notice. The Decommissioning Ceremony will be conducted in accordance with reference (a) and (b) as outlined in enclosures (1) through (6).

4. Organization of Troops

a. The Battalion will be organized into three companies. Each company will consist of four squads, guide and platoon commander as appropriate, company commanders and guidon bearers. Battalion in three companies, thirteen-man front. b. The Color Detail will consist of two color bearers and two color guards. (inclement weather only.)

INCLEMENT WEATHER

27 July - Check theater for possible use due to forecast of inclement weather. Make final arrangements if needed (CMAA). Ensure backup sound system is in place and operable (CMAA).

28 July - OOD report weather to XO.

- 1200 Initial weather prognosis/foul weather decision made.
- 1600 (Approx) Place chairs and official party seating in theater (CMAA).
- 1700 (Approx) Move Public address system and speaker rostrum into position (CMAA).
- 1700 Position television camera and check system. (PAO)
- If definitely an inclement day, with poor prognosis for clearing, decision will be made at this time or soon thereafter. Advise CMAA of decision to proceed with Foul Weather Plan immediately. (If Foul Weather Ceremony is declared later due to sudden deterioration of weather, actions described below will have to be compressed and accomplished rapidly. Therefore, the duty section will be required to provide necessary working party assistance to accelerate preparations).
- 1800 Post Gate Guards equipped with mobile radios. Brief Gate Guards to render appropriate military courtesies, direct arriving guests to parking and report arrival of VIP, Flag and General Officers by radio to Head Usher.
- 1815 Post Ushers (Head Ushers).
- 1815 Seating by Company in theater. Color Guard in aisle at rear of theater. One Platoon (or other predetermined number) of troops fall in from each Company.
- 1830 Band sets up in theater.
- 1830 Battalion formed Ready for Ceremony.

- 1845 Color Guard take position near front entrance in preparation for entry stand clear of arriving official party.
- 1850 Arrival of VIPs. Band sounds attention.
- 1855 Official Party arrives.
- 1900 Commence ceremony.
- 2000 (Approx) Ceremony completed.
- 2030 Clear theater return equipment (CBC).

GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Personnel in formation sized front to rear, right to left and will execute the proper positions of attention, parade rest, and eyes right until these movements are terminated by command only.
- 2. No dark glasses will be worn.
- 3. No name tags. pencils, identification bracelets, combs, or other nonuniform items will be worn or showing on the uniform.
- 4. Color Bearers will carry the Colors at a uniform angle.
- 5. Personnel will wear clean freshly pressed uniforms, with covers worn squarely on the head.
- 6. Shoes and brass will be polished to a high gloss.
- 7. All haircuts and shaves will be in compliance with current Navy Uniform Regulations.
- 8. No chewing gum or tobacco in ranks.
