1. In accordance with reference (a), MCB SIXTY-TWO's Operations Report for the period 26 February to 25 March 1967 is forwarded herewith.

2. Employment Status. In accordance with reference (b), U. S. Naval Mobile Construction Battalion SIXTY-TWO is deployed to Hue/Phu Bai. The primary mission of the Battalion is construction in support of the 30th Naval Construction Regiment. There are no units detached.

a. Camp Campbell's generator problems seem to be solved with the arrival of 3 - 100KW generators. Two 200KW generators are scheduled for delivery to the camp which will allow 2-100KW generators to be installed at the quarry.

10. Civic Action.

a. A total of 751 persons received medical or dental care at daily village sick call. There were 1,336 medical treatments and 72 dental procedures rendered.

b. Than Phu Orphanage was given 11,800 piasters for the scholarship fund and the Than Phu Public School was given 3,000 piasters in scholarship funds for three students. Hydrated cement was distributed to Kin Long Orphanage in Hue (220 bags), Phu Bai Parish Refugee Camp (480 bags), Christian Missionary Alliance in Hue (210 bags), and to the Than Phu Orphanage (14 bags). Scrap wood was distributed to Than Phu Orphanage (one truckload), Christian Missionary Alliance in Hue (two truckloads), Phu Bai III (one truckload), and to Phu Bai Village (two truckloads). The Than Phu Orphanage received 10 pounds of food and 10 pounds of clothing and the Than Luong Orphanage received 20 pounds of clothing and 20 pounds of school supplies. Also the World Relief Commission Refugee School in Hue received 15 pounds of miscellaneous school supplies. Hue Technical High School was given nine feet of eighteen inch diameter reforcing stock, five feet of four inch brass stock, four feet of five inch brass stock and some old generators, oil filters, and regulators. Cake and ice cream were taken to Than Phu Orphanage to celebrate the Seabee birthday.

c. English language instruction was rendered at the Than Phu Orphanage to four adults for a period of two hours.
