10. Civic Action.

- a. A total of 1,098 persons received medical/dental care at the village daily sick call. There were 2,032 medical and 105 dental procedures rendered.
- b. The Pha Kuam Orphanage in Hus received forty-seven pieces of aluminum reofing and seven pieces of rebar for construction purposes. Over three handred dollars worth of Lacquerware was sold to the men of the Battalion. These items were made by the students at the Lacquerware School in Hus. Six pigs (one purebred boar and five crossbred guilts) along with ninty pounds of dry feed were delivered to the three familys at Thuy Chas.
- c. One hundred twenty-five bags of USAID Cement, rebar and fifty sheets of tin were delivered to the Thuy Chau village for construction of the village dispensary.










