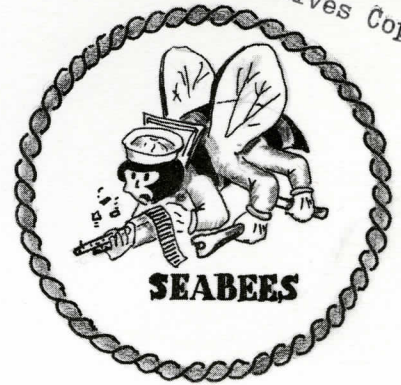

a. No Equipment Status Report is included as all equipment being used by the Battalion is on a Class B assignment from the TWENTIETH Naval Construction Regiment.

b. All materials for homeport construction projects have been provided by the TWENTIETH Naval Construction Regiment or customer activity. Accordingly a Fiscal Summary of Construction Operations is not included in this report.

c. No Civic Action assistance or projects have been undertaken during the reporting period.

2. Unit Movements.

- 1 January 1969 - A 100 man flag detail departed for New Orleans to participate in the Sugar Bowl, returning to Gulfport the same day.
- 2-5 January 1969 - A three truck, six man convoy departed at 0900 2 January 1969 from CBC Gulfport, Mississippi arriving at the Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune, North Carolina at 1800 5 January 1969.
- 4 January 1969 - 171 NMCB SIXTY-TWO personnel deployed by Navy and Marine airlift to Camp Lejeune via U. S. Marine Corps Air

Station (MCAS), Cherry Point, North Carolina.

17-21 January 1969- 176 NMCB SIXTY-TWO personnel departed on Navy C-131 aircraft from Navy Squadron VR-1, via MCAS Cherry Point, N. C. for CBC, Gulfport, Mississippi.

18-22 January 1969- A three truck, six man convoy departed Camp Lejeune at 1700 18 January arriving at CBC, Gulfport at 1430 22 January 1969.

3. Significant Events.

- 1 January 1969 - A 100 man flag detail under the direction of LTJG H.P. BEASLEY, USNR participated in the pregame ceremonies at the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans.
- 5-17 January 1969 - Military training including crew served weapons training and leadership training was conducted at the Marine Corps Base, Camp Lejeune.
- 15-16 January 1969- CDR J. P. JONES, Jr., CEC, USN, Commanding Officer, NMCB SIXTY-TWO conducted an informal inspection of NMCB SIXTY-TWO's Provisional Rifle/Weapons Company training at Camp Lejeune.
- 16 January 1969 - 1830: A cocktail party was given by the officers of NMCB SIXTY-TWO in conjunction with the officers of NMCB FIFTY-EIGHT for the host Battalion, 2nd Battalion, 2nd Marines. CDR J. P. JONES, Jr., CEC, USN, presented the NMCB SIXTY-TWO plaque to the 2nd Battalion, 2nd Marines in appreciation of their assistance.
- 22-23 January 1969- A Pre-Admin Inspection of NMCB SIXTY-TWO was conducted by the TWENTIETH Naval Construction Regiment.
- 24 January 1969 - 1900: A "Dining Out" was held by the officers of NMCB SIXTY-TWO at the Keesler Air Force Base Officers Club, Biloxi, Mississippi.
- 27 January 1969 - The Battalion commenced 4 weeks of Block Military Training, consisting of one week each of Classroom Training, Company Tactics, Company Commanders Week, and Battalion Tactics at CBC, Gulfport, and Keesler Air Force Base (KAFB) Training Area.
